My children were enjoying this night market. Looking at their happy faces. I felt the summer heat seemed to run away and had a happy smile naturally.



#### Three functions of the TSUBA

#### **★**To protect Samurai's body

- · Not to cut his hands due to poor handling of swords
- ·To prevent his hands from enemy's attack.

#### **★To fix balance**

**TSUBA** 

- Fitting

- ★lt is convenient to draw a sword • To make a sword flat when it enters in the fitting
- ·To make it easy to draw a sword from its sheath after pushing slightly the TSUBA ·To keep balance when Samurai has one. ·To get a sharp cutting by changing sword's with the thumb of hand to hold a sheath

#### What was the material of TSUBA?

It was mainly made of various kinds of material like IRON, COPPER (CRUD COPPER. SHAKUDO(gold copper alloy)). BRASS. SILVER and so on.


The man firstly produced the TSUBA was a sword smith who was good at forging iron. (← 'Tosho TSUBA). The more the number of wars increased, the more the demands for swords went up. Simultaneously. the requests for making the TSUBA multiplied.

Then, the production of them was unable to keep up with demands. Technicians to make general armours also started to crate them with using extra iron (←'Kacchushi TSUBA).

The characteristics of these two TSUBA had no design at all or had small openwork.

#### The appearance of special sword smith

It was said that the time special sword smiths to create the TSUBA may be at the beginning of Muromachi Era. Because the 'Onin TSUBA' which was likely to produced during the



In every place of Japan, special sword smiths to make the TSUBA increased and they were highly come in handy by powerful Samurai. The TSUBA changed from simple to highly decorative.

#### Takamori Saigo

a great man. the pride of Kagoshima

Satsuma Domain let Saigo, who might be in custody by Ansei Purge begun since 1859, run away to Amami-island. After that, he had been exiled to an island soon again. But when he was 33 year's old, he was just about to play a big role toward Meiji Restoration. It was his 49-yeas old when he was defeated in the Satsuma Rebellion, the last civil war after Meiji Restoration, and killed himself.



#### Takayoshi Kido His life is full of worries

On March 7, 1866, the Satsuma-Choshu alliance was formed in Kyoto, which was a military alliance between Satsuma and Choshu clans. The two clans which had had huge political influence entered into the alliance. That fact accelerated the movement to overthrow the Shogunate. He was 33 years old at that time When Takayoshi heard the news of Satsuma Rebellion in his sickbed, he muttered, 'Saigo, that's enough......' . And he passed away when he was 43 years old.







#### Toshimichi Okubo

What I left was not a lot of heritage, but astronomical debts

He was promoted the position of Okonando-Todori in Satsuma clan and became a close advisor of Hisamitsu Shimazu who held real power. That time was when he was 33 years old. He got the hatred from an opposed party that he had forced Saigo, a close friend of him, to commit suicide and was assassinated by six former samurais with gripes. That was the Kioizaka Incident when he was 47 years old. He completed public works with his private funds and paid national debts with his property. He is one of politicians Japanese people are proud of.
