The god of war who liked Tofu very much







Originally, he was a doctor

Even though he was called the god of war, he was born in Suō Province (Bofu-shi, Yamaguchi Prefecture) as a child of doctor. In his younger days, he was studying Rangaku, the studies of Dutch and of Western sciences, culture and technique through Dutch, in order to succeed a doctor in the village. Afterwards, he is said to take over a doctor. But, because he was unfriendly and did not like medical examination, he guitted a doctor.



His skills for translating was excellent

When he was 29 years old, the Black Ships arrived in Japan. After this incident, the knowledge of



scholar of Dutch learning was in high demand. He got a job in Uwajima Domain (Uwajima-shi, Ehime Prefecture). After that, he also got a position of professor in Kobusho, a military school founded by the shogunate which would be his enemy.

He allegedly had the most excellent skill for translating in Japan at that time. As he had translated the latest Western books completely, he got a medal by the shogunate.

The beginning of War God

When he was 36 years old, he delivered a lecture for military science at the office of Chōshū Domain. In this lecture, he met

Kogoro Katsura, later Takayoshi Kido. Because he and Kogoro Kido were the persons from Yamaguchi, he was appointed as a feudal retainer of Choshu Domain. When he was 42 years old, the second conquest of Choshu, Shogunate's sending troops in order to make a disciplinary measure to Choshu Domain, was occurred. Omura defeated the shogunate forces completely with the latest arms and tactics.



He was a doctor and had been learnt Duch studies. But why did he have magnificent abilities in military strategy? He read a lot of specialized books written in Japanese language in targeted fields for translation, gained the enough knowledge and translated Western books. These facts are said to be the reason why he improved his high technique of translation. And it is said that he read foreign books written about cutting-edge weapons and tactics, applied those knowledge which the Samurais in those days were not available and unable to use them in actual battlefields. After this war, he suppressed the Shogitai, a group of former Tokugawa retainers, in Boshin War in a day and got unbelievable results as well.

Such Masujiro Omura, the War God, spent a frugal life and he liked to drink Japanese Sake with Tofu. His most favourite foods was Tofu and he often served only Tofu to his visitors even someone visited his place. He gives what he likes, not thinking about how his guests feel.

It is same as his anecdote in his doctor's days. I can find his clumsy character in it.

By the way, he was a original proposer of Yasukuni-jinja Shrine where the souls of war dead after the closing days of Tokugawa Shogunate were worshipped. Even his idea was different, he made every efforts to build Tokyo Shokonsha Shrine (later Yasukuni-jinja Shrine),a place to enshrine a lot of war victims in Boshin War.

Such Tatemono's names are changed according to the attached places



- At first, only the head of dragons was used, Afterwards, all shapes of dragons were formed in the period of Northern and Southern Courts.
- From Muromachi to Edo periods, dragons were made of wood carvings with gold leaf. Lions were wood carvings covered with black lacquer, vermilion lacquer and gold leaf. Various kinds of small and big Tatemono were produced in those periods.
- In Edo period, lions got horns. Their shapes were similar to the faces of demons from their appearances. So, everybody came to call it 'Shikami'.







After the late Muromachi Period. Tatemono came to be attached generally except outstanding helmets. Some Tatemono for fun which were not appropriate

for marks showing Samurai were made as well. In the Edo period, toys for children were used as Tatemono, which lost the meaning of original Tatemono, too.

According to change of times, the types of general armours and helmets had been changed. The decoration of helmet was also changed. At first, Tatemono was for intimidating an enemy, But, it had been changed to what appealed own character freely.

Like this. Tatemono has so many varieties of types. If I were a general. I would choose the Tatemono of praying mantis because of bad outlooks and superstitions. How about your selection? I recommend you to choose different Tatemono in order to change the atmosphere of your helmet a little bit.
